Extreme climate and weather events, associated disasters, and emergent risks are becoming increasingly critical in the context of global environmental change.



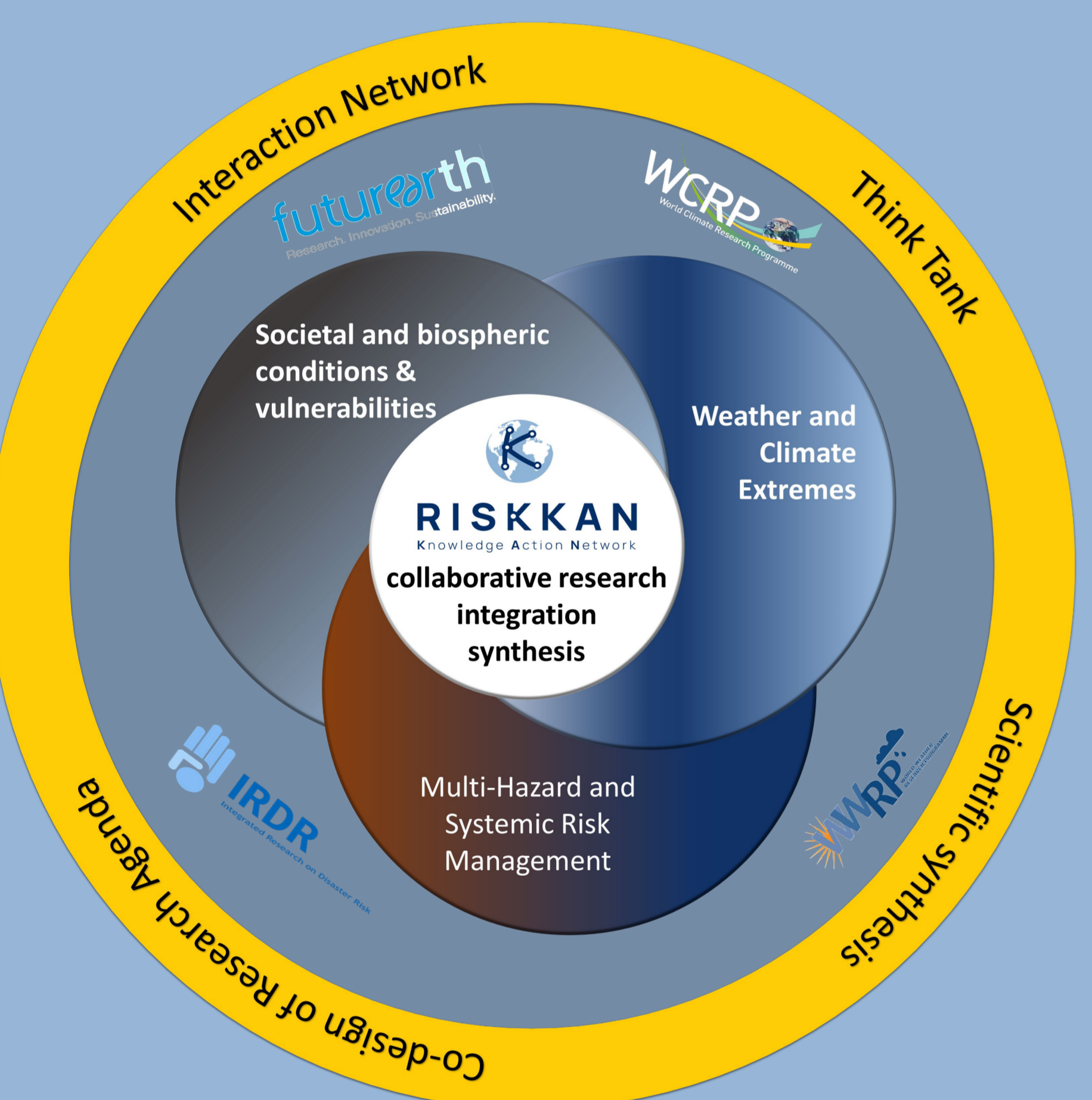
